Despite beginning his journey on CHERUB uncertainly, James now muses over his development over the past year, recognizing the hard work and discipline he learned, culminating in skills that allowed him to keep his head





during dangerous situations. In discussing Keith Moore, James shows a nuanced understanding of the man's dual nature as both charming and criminal. Meryl reinforces that although Moore tried to keep a distance from the brutal side of the drug business, he was fully aware of its darker aspects.

Meryl informs James that he will not be given another mission until the new year due to his school absences. Although slightly disappointed, James is also relieved at the prospect of a break from the high-stress environment of missions.

James candidly discusses his lingering trauma from the mission, admitting his unease over the dangers he faced, including a fatal encounter. Meryl reassures him, arranging for counselling to help him process these experiences.

Later, James meets with Kerry, who playfully teases him about punishment laps, none of which Meryl had assigned due to his improved behavior. James shares the news of his break from missions, revealing his contentment with the idea of spending time on campus and casually dismissing the significance of his achievements, including earning his navy CHERUB T-shirt, much to Kerry's chagrin, as she strives for similar accomplishments.

The conversation shifts from playful banter to a possible romance as James suggests a walk. They joke about Kerry's moderate punishment for drug use





and engage in flirtatious teasing, ultimately making plans for a romantic pursuit while subtly maintaining their camaraderie.

As evening falls, James and Kerry, along with other CHERUB kids, visit the local bowling alley. Content and relaxed, James reflects on his journey from a year ago, marveling at how much his life has changed since joining CHERUB. He thinks of his time on campus, the friendships formed, and the respect he has earned over time. CHERUB, once unfamiliar and intimidating, now feels like home to James, marking a poignant transformation since the loss of his mother.
