

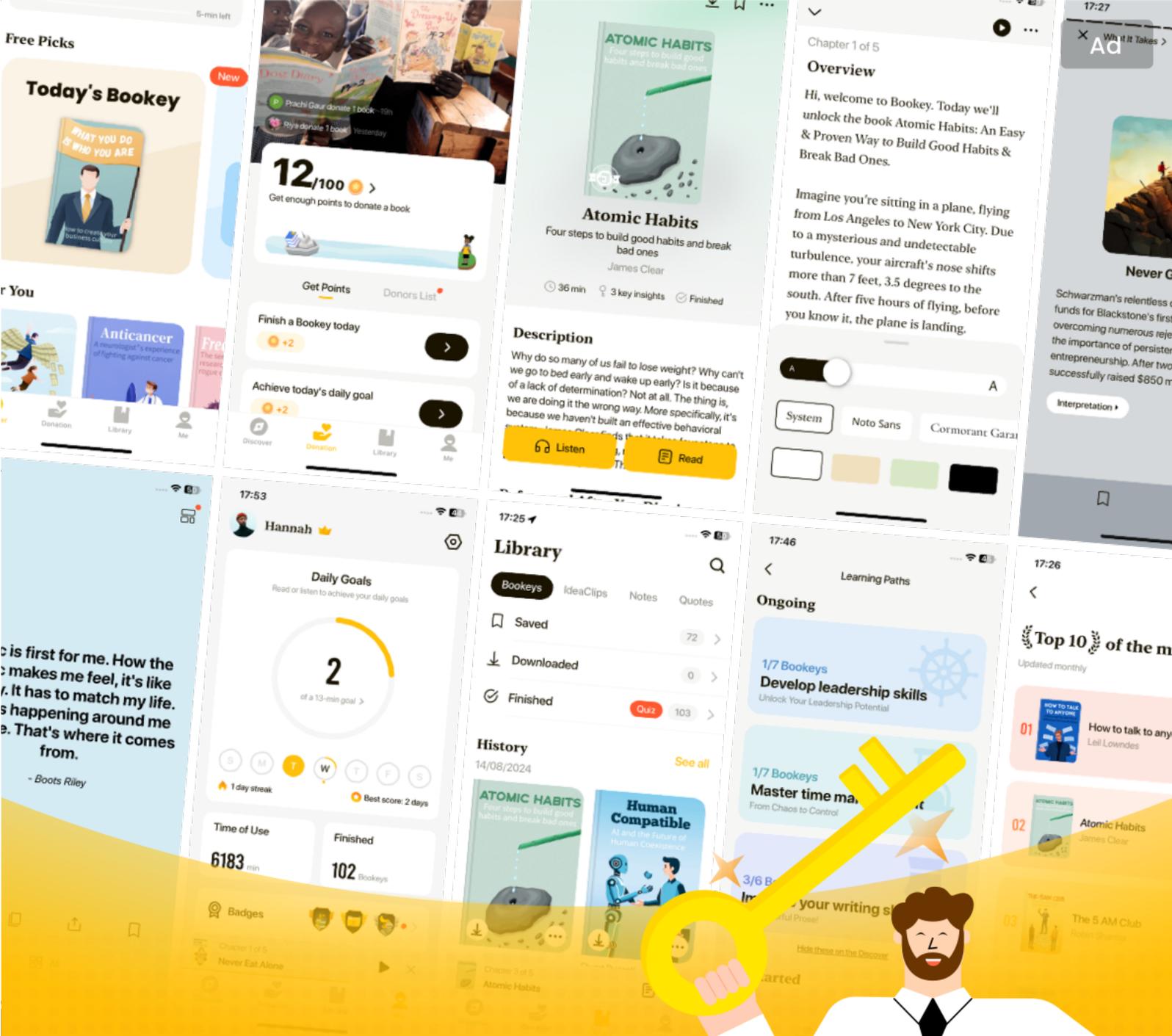

accept that we had to cull the herds we had painstakingly acquired, leading to lengthy negotiations with authorities that stretched over eighteen months. We eventually opted for a rigorous testing regimen that ultimately came back clear, but not without further delaying our financial recovery.
